# RECTOR'S COLUMN

*Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established.*  
(Proverbs 16:3)

Dear Family and Friends of Trinity Everett,

With September and the recognition of Labor Day (September 7), the official season of summer comes to an end. As young people return to school, it's always the case that folks also return to regular attendance at church – hopefully, after enjoying restful vacations, various adventures and good visits with family and friends. I always enjoy the September of the church year. For me it's like the old time TV announcer interrupting a favorite show with a special announcement, then following up with, "We now return you to your regularly scheduled programming..." The break was good, but I really love our program!

Sunday, September 13, is "Welcome Sunday" at Trinity. This is an old tradition in The Episcopal Church – it's the time when we are encouraged to invite people who may not have darkened the door of a church for many years to attend services with us. For some of us, that might be us! In any case, all people are especially welcomed to the church, our choir returns from its summer break, and our first adult education program for the season is held from 12-2PM.

On Welcome Sunday, we will also be including a brief rite within our service for the "Blessing of the Backpacks." Young people returning to school are invited to bring their school backpacks to be blessed at the altar. Additionally, anyone – young or old, child or adult) is invited to bring their personal book bags, briefcases, knitting bags, satchels or laptop bags to be blessed. So, circle September 13 on your calendar and remember to bring your bag/case with you to any of our three church services that day.

In September, many of our guilds and ministries that took a hiatus during the summer also start back up – such as, St. Mary's Altar Guild (September 2 at 10AM), Daughters of the King (September 3 at 1:00), and St. Catherine's Guild (a food preparation ministry that supports event receptions for funerals, weddings and community dinners – September 16 at 12:00).

Sunday September 20, Trinity will hold its annual "Ministry Fair" in Rogers' Hall, an occasion when our various ministries, groups and guilds are asked to set up an information display about their ministry or work in order to educate the parish and potentially recruit new group or ministry members. If your ministry or group wants to reserve a table at the Ministry Fair, please contact our Parish Administrator, Kelly DiCicco, at the church office – 425-315-4033.



This year at the Ministry Fair, we are looking forward to introducing at least two new groups; “Pet & Animal Ministries” and “Legacy Giving.”

Also on September 20<sup>th</sup>, our Sunday School program year begins. There will be a Sunday School open house in Merrick Hall (the downstairs area of Trinity). Finally, on Sunday, September 27, we will formally install and bless our Sunday School teachers and Youth Group leaders.

Around the beginning of September you should receive in the mail a letter from me, along with a tri-fold form from our Stewardship Team inviting you to share what ministries and areas of church life in which you are willing to give of your time, skills or interest. Please take a moment to complete that form, which you can bring to church on a Sunday, drop off any time or mail. Each one of you is a gift from God to this community, and we want to know how best to incorporate you into the life of your church community in ways that are meaningful and fulfilling for all of us.

The month of September brings with it the first breezes of autumn and colorful days of harvest, hearth and home. Our church community is a place where I pray that God knows all of these in us – a harvest of what God has made in each of us, a hearth where the Holy Spirit burns brightly in our hearts, and a home where Christ is welcomed in each and every being. It’s a very good month and a very good time to renew our awareness that we ourselves are called to be God’s harvest, hearth and home.

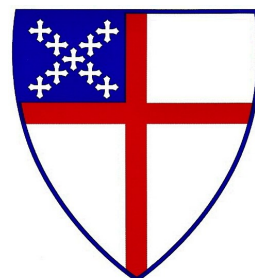

# TREASURER TIDBITS

Well, the time has come that we bid farewell to summer (for me personally I say- Praise Jesus for this!) and begin to look forward to our new program year here at Trinity. I hope you had a wonderful summer, safe travels and got in some great site seeing. While you were away, and even if you were here, things continued to progress and our bills continued on for the summer. As you will recall we had a planned deficit budget for 2015. In years past we have been able to make up this deficit. This year to date, while we are doing well and have much to celebrate in the way of growth, we have not been as successful at closing this deficit. This is driven by several things:



- The timing of pledges coming in- note that overall we are doing well- but some of our annual pledges we hope to see sooner vs. later. Our weekly and monthly givers seem to be rate on pace overall with few exceptions
- No income from the Little House due to the move of our tenants

The result of this is that our cash flow has suffered and we have been forced to borrow from our dedicated accounts to pay our monthly bills and payroll. We expect some of this to even out as we get into September and throughout the rest of the year. The Vestry had a great fund raiser in June and this was very helpful. We have several more coming up, but the majority of the money raised in these will not come in until December, and this is going to continue to put pressure on our cash flow situation. If you happen to be feeling extra generous, or would like to say thank you to God for the heat and sun this past summer- why not consider a thanks offering to Trinity? My offering is going to be in thanksgiving that this oppressive summer is nearly over and coming to an end..... but any reason to give thanks, is a reason to give back a little extra.



Soon you will start to hear about the 2016 Stewardship campaign. Please prayerfully begin to consider your support of Trinity as we move through the next months. Please also include the business group, the Vestry and the leadership team in your prayers as we prepare the budget for 2016. It takes all of us, and lots of prayerful consideration to get this completed.

As always, if you have any questions about our finances, please see me or Evie Beard. We are happy to discuss them with you. Thank you for all that you do to support Trinity in big and small ways.

# FAITH FORMATION NEWS

## Nursery Opening

Do you know a high school or college student who is looking for part time work?

Our nursery assistant position is open. Applicants can talk with Kelly DiCicco, our parish administrator, for an application. This person will need to complete First Aid and CPR certification and attend a Safeguarding God's Children class.

Adult Forum will begin a new schedule beginning Sunday, September 13. From now on, each Forum class will be held from 12-2 PM on the second Sunday of each month.

September's topic is "Dismantling the Culture of Violence" presented by Paul Benz, a co-leader of Faith Action Network based in Seattle. The next Adult Forum will be Sunday, October 11. A complete list of Forum topics for Fall 2015 will be in the Narthex.



Blessing of the Backpacks is during the 10:00 service on Sunday, September 13. Children, students, teachers, librarians and anyone studying or working in a setting for learning and teaching may bring your briefcases, tote bags, book bags and computer bags for the blessing.

Sunday September 6 and 13 are Sunday School Registration days for families whose children will be attending Godly Play (ages 3-8) and Weaving God's Promises (ages 9 through 11). Junior and High School students will complete their own registrations when they attend Journey to Adulthood.

Journey to Adulthood begins at 9:00 AM on Sunday, September 20 in the Trinity Youth Group room in Merrick Hall. Students 12 to 18 are eligible for this class. Sunday School classes for children 3-11 also begin on September 20 at 10:00 AM.



The Sunday School Open House for parents and families is during the Coffee Hour on Sunday, September 27. Find out more about what your children are learning and how they are learning it, meet new families and take a look at classrooms.

Looking ahead: Children 3-11 and students 12-18 who wish to participate will act out the Gospel story "Jesus and the Blind Man" on October 25 during the 10:00 service. Pastor Rachel and I want to increase children's participation in the "upstairs" worship and engage children more deeply in the Gospel. Parts descriptions will be posted on the Christian Formation bulletin board in the Narthex beginning Sunday, September 6.

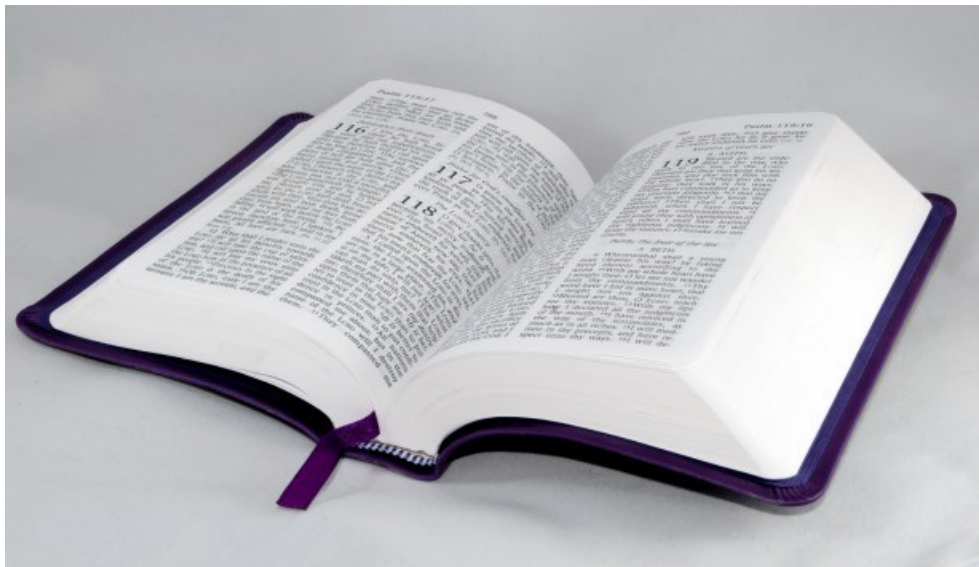

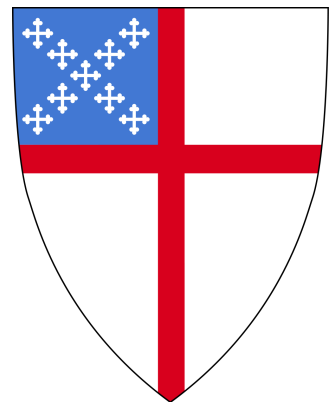

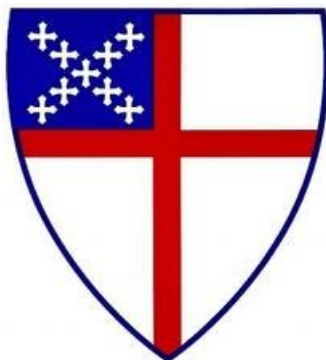
